#### Dear Friends,



What a fantastic final term it has been in Year 5! The children have rocketed their way through our 'To Infinity and Beyond' topic, blasting off into the incredibly exciting world of our Solar System when learning about the movement of the planets, our moon and the sun. A fabulous visit to The National Space Centre, guizzes, experiments and practical activities have helped to deepen their knowledge further and inspire them to look at what exists beyond our world. They have created some beautiful non-chronological reports on the gas giant Saturn and the British astronaut Tim Peake. The children have developed their use of punctuation, focused on technical language and informed their readers in their writing. There have also been some stunning and imaginative homework projects to show off their newly found knowledge of Space facts. In Maths they have continued to work on their fluency and pace of times tables recall, building on their arithmetic skills through Fluency in Five, understanding properties of shape and measuring volume. In PSHE they have broadened their understanding of the changes they will be going through as they go through puberty, both physically and emotionally, whilst learning the correct anatomical names for parts of their bodies. They have also continued their 'Passport' lessons, focussing on fairness, justice and what is right. The children have consolidated their learning about how different faiths express their religious beliefs by making their own artistic creations to answer the Big Question: 'What unites us?'. We have been stunned by how they have used their God given talents to do this through art, dance, music and words.
