Christingle celebrations have been taking place for over 50 years. Christingles themselves go back much further to the Moravian church in Germany. At a children's service in Marienborn in 1747, Bishop Johannes de Watteville looked for a simple way to explain the happiness that had come to people through Jesus, and created a symbol — the Christingle — to do this. This year we will be celebrating Christingle in a special Collective Worship in school and we would like to encourage you to attend one of the family Christingle services within our local community: Bourne Abbey Church on 11th December at 3pm and Bourne Baptist Church on 24th December at 4.30pm. Both churches ask you to take your own orange.
