Dream Big is our new topic for our English learning this term. We will be immersing ourselves into the lives of diverse explorers from around the world. Firstly, we will work towards creating their very own non-chronological reports about two astounding explorers: Lakpa Rita Sherpa and Rick Hansen. The children will begin by using their inference and retrieval skills to learn about these inspiring real-life heroes. They will develop their reading fluency skills by echo and choral reading extracts from Alastair Humphrey's astonishing 'Great Adventurers' book. With confidence, children will be able to use adverbial phrases, fronted adverbials with commas and co-ordinating conjunctions in their non-chronological reports. They will share their reports with Bourne Abbey children to receive constructive feedback to reflect on when writing their second report. In Term 6, we will be focusing on narrative writing. The children will explore the book 'How does chocolate taste on Everest?' to learn the importance of using their 5 senses to write descriptively.

Magnificent Maths

In Maths, we will be continuing to develop our knowledge in fractions where we consolidate adding and subtracting. We will then delve into money, where we will be finding change, converting, adding and subtracting. Towards the end of term, we will be focusing on time where we will be looking at units of time, roman numerals and solving

problems.
