The Bible offers a beautiful and practical guide on how to live with love, especially in friendships. It describes love as patient and kind, free from envy, boasting, and pride. These qualities are foundational to healthy relationships, showing us how to support, understand, and care for one another.

Loving God,


Bless my life with the gift of friendship. For those who have chosen to be my friends, I am grateful.
