

Twist, the imagined sister of Oliver Twist.


The Lost Magician by Piers Torday is inspired by Narnia. Rumaysa by Radiya Hafiza takes fairytales and gives them a middle eastern spin.


How Do Meerkats Order Pizza?



Flying Eye Books 10+




Marvin and the Book of Magic


Pablo and Splash
