In maths we will consolidate our addition and subtraction skills before moving on to our money unit. We will identify coins and notes, count in pounds and pence and find different ways to make the same amount. Throughout our multiplication and division unit, we will be counting in 2's, 3's, 5's and 10's to become fluent with our times tables. We will then go on to find fractions of shapes, amounts and numbers using thirds, halves and quarters.
